# Renew Your Resident Pass Before It Expires!

Resident passes need to be updated every three years. Passes updated in 2019 will expire on December 31. Have you updated your resident pass or lease information with the business office?

Anyone one year old or older needs to have a resident pass. Anyone that is 12 years old or older will need to have a picture taken. Anyone 18 years or older will need to provide proof of residency (i.e., driver's license with KROC address on it, change of address from the DMV or Post Office, Voter ID card with the KROC address on it, school or university transcript with the KROC

address on it, or a pay stub with the KROC address on it).

You can come to the business office to renew your resident pass, or you can renew your resident pass on Townsa.

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# Budget Impacts for the Operations Department

As we all are aware, inflation reached a 40-year high of 9.1% in June of this year.

increased. Even though the price of gas, also at an all-time high in June, has started to come down, most other increases have not and will not. These increases impact your homeowner association (HOA) just like any other consumer, affecting the costs of your assessments.

One of the biggest increases besides the overall landscaping cost is our trash and recycling services. This is due to the increase in wages, of course, gas prices, and the increase in the county tipping fees at the landfills across the county. The tipping fee is a pass-through cost from the trash hauler to HOAs. It is a fee based on the weight of waste per ton. This fee has gone up twice in 2022, and there has been a fuel surcharge once this year. This \$1.50 per townhome/single-family unit per month was not included in the 2022 budget but will have to be included in the 2023 budget along with the normal contract increase.

The effects of climate change also impact us financially. It has negative influences on the health of our horticulture within the community. With the temperatures in large swings of higher highs and more consistent warmer weather, stronger storms, and more frequent storms, climate change carries a larger adverse impact. Not to get too scientific here, plants and, more specifically, trees can benefit from more CO2, but not at the rate at which it has reached. Rising levels of CO2 in the atmosphere reduce the needed nutrients essential to the plants' growth. As the atmosphere warms, it draws more water out of the trees, resulting in increased water stress that causes an accelerated risk of decline and death. It raises the levels and outbreaks of harmful insects and diseases and reduces the number of beneficial insects and microorganisms that help to defend against these infestations.

The numbers tell the story of the overwhelming impact climate change has on our trees. In 2020 we removed 216 trees, and 221 were removed in 2021. We have already removed over 300 trees in the first eight months of 2022. Most of these were due to insect infestations and/or disease, moisture stress, and weakened wood. The cost of tree removal has gone up over the course of those years, especially this year, due to the gas and labor increases. The cost of replacing trees has also increased greatly. The more trees we remove, the more that need replacing, which costs the community more on both ends.

We planted Pocomoke crape myrtle shrubs on many of the walls over the last few years to allow for color rotation during the growing season and to complement our signature tree, the Tuscarora crape myrtle, which has not had any health issues until this year. These shrubs, along with our crape myrtle trees, have been infected with aphids and/or scales related to the change in the climate. We have not had these kinds of infestations in recent years. The cost of treating these nove issues was not something budgeted in the past. Moving forward, we will need to provide funds in the budget for treating these pop-up infestations. We also lost many of our Pocomoke shrubs due to large swings in the weather temperatures. They could not handle the colder temperatures of the past winter after experiencing the much hotter temperatures of the previous growing season.

In our survey of the community completed in 2020, how the community looks was noted as the most important feature of living in Kingstowne. The Board of Trustees (BOT) has allotted funds over the last ten years to put an annual pruning program in place for all the trees in the common areas, an intensive and costly program to address the erosion issues in the community, and now is looking at funding a program to annually address the naturalized areas that border common elements. These areas are encroaching increasingly on private lots and reducing the common grass buffers. Staff and the BOT will continue to commit funds and resources to make sure the community looks its best, but that comes at a cost. We will do our best to mitigate price increases by bidding out projects and finding the most cost-efficient options.

- All decorative materials must be within the boundaries of the lot. No decorations may be placed in or extended into the common areas or adjacent neighboring lots.
- Exterior holiday decorations may be placed on a lot 30 days in advance of the holiday and must be removed no later than 14 days after the holiday, weather permitting.
- December exterior holiday decorations may be placed out as early as the day after Thanksqiving and may remain on display until January 15.

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# Keys to Peacefully Solving a Dispute With Your Neighbor

# Know Your Community, County, and State Laws, Regulations & Ordinances

Before you ask your neighbor to correct a situation, you may want to know if they are violating a law/ ordinance or if it is simply something you dislike. Sometimes, your neighbor



may be violating a law or ordinance without even knowing it. If that is the case, a polite reminder could remedy the situation. In the event that your neighbor ignores the reminder or reacts negatively to it, it is also important to be familiar with your community's policies on corrective action in order to help navigate those waters.

## Don't React in the Moment

Do not react to something that may be an issue in the moment. To avoid a reaction that is influenced by emotion, allow yourself time to think clearly about a potential problem before bringing it up. A hasty and perhaps less-diplomatic interaction with a neighbor that

has been heavily influenced by a tough day at work may result in an immediate correction to a situation but it may also result in a strained relationship and less-open communication.

## Put Yourself in Their Position

Being a good neighbor sometimes means helping others out. You never know what someone else is going through at a particular time. If someone seems to be doing something that appears out of character based on previous experiences, give them



the benefit of the doubt and perhaps even offer a helping hand. Being understanding and supportive in someone's time of need can work wonders on long-term relations.

# **Avoid Stacking Complaints**



When the time does come for you to discuss your issue with your neighbor, be sure to focus on the issue you want to resolve and avoid stacking complaints. stacking complaints may make your neighbor become overwhelmed or even defensive and that would be counterpro-

ductive in regard to solving the dilemma.

# Open a Line of Communication and Try to Discuss the Issue



Taking the first leap to try and communicate an issue with your neighbor can be a stressful situation. Developing a relationship and open line of communication with your neighbor can go a long way in regard to helping prevent situations from becoming

ongoing issues. Exchanging contact information or communicating in person frequently can make the situation less uncomfortable and raise the likelihood of a positive response.

# Avoid "Ganging Up" or Gossiping

While asking for a fellow neighbor's guidance or suggestions on an issue or dispute is a great way to get another point of view or insight on a situation, it is important to avoid "ganging up" or gossiping about a neighbor. Including another person in your dispute



may make your neighbor feel defensive and turn them off to a peaceful resolution. Also, gossip has a unique tendency for getting back to the person being discussed. Avoid gossiping or spreading rumors because they can permanently damage neighbor relations and close off any lines of communication.
